

ERICH SCHOENBECK MEMORIAL TOURNAMENT
AUGUST 24; SEPTEMBER 7, 14, 21 & 27, 2008

The season-ending tournament is dedicated to the memory of Erich Schoenbeck. Erich was manager of what is now the Greens FC team and was instrumental in the start-up and growth of the St. Albert Men's Masters Recreational Soccer League. Erich collapsed at the end of a pick-up soccer game and passed away on February 10, 2002. Those of us who knew him found it fitting that his last meaningful physical activity was playing the sport that he loved so much.

Tournament Guidelines:

- All teams are asked to line up and shake hands BEFORE and after each game as a demonstration of good sportsmanship and in the recreational spirit of the league. The professionals do it before international matches and don't forget that you are setting an example for the children and families who will be watching;
- ***ALL PLAYERS MUST BE CARDED PER LEAGUE RULES AND MUST PRESENT THEIR PLAYER CARD TO THE REFEREE PRIOR TO EACH TOURNAMENT GAME. ABSOLUTELY NO EXCEPTIONS!***

- **League and ASA rules concerning rough play and unsportsmanlike conduct will be strictly enforced. Per league rules, there will be a zero tolerance policy towards rough play and unsportsmanlike conduct;**
- Teams will play two (2) 45 minute halves with "injury" time to be added on at referees discretion;
- If tied at the end of second half, there will be one 10-minute overtime period. Note: Per FIFA rules, the game does not automatically end if a goal ("Golden Goal") is scored in the extra time (i.e. the full 10-minute overtime period + any applicable extra time at the referee's discretion must be played);
- If tied at the end of the overtime period, there will a penalty shoot-out with each team choosing three (3) players to alternate shots until a winner is declared. Players taking penalty shots do not have to be on the field at the end of the game to participate in the shoot-out;
- Bottom Line: Each game must produce a winner!
- Teams receive (3) three points for a win, one (1) point for an overtime or shoot-out loss and zero (0) points for a loss in regular time;
- At the end of Group Play, if teams end up with the same number of points, tie breakers will be as follows: 1) Head to Head; 2) Goals Against (excluding penalty kicks); 3) Goals For (excluding penalty kicks); 4) Coin toss;
